

Aust. Rules, first game:

Southport wins from Central

Sunday's first Australian Rules football game between Southport and Centrals played on the Labrador field, attracted an attendance estimated by delighted officials at more than 1000.

Southport (first club to be formed on the Gold Coast) were too good for the younger Central Club, whose home-ground is Currumbin-Palm Beach.

Southport won 8-10-58 to 6-11-47.

Well-known Southport players who kicked goals were Brown, Radcliffe and Shearing (two each), Gray and Manuels (one each).

For Centrals Griffith (3), Newton and Stubbs and Lane scored.

Officials greatly heartened by the public response to the first game, immediately arranged a return match which will be played on Central's ground on Sunday, July 9.
